


## The Development in Municipal Healthcare – Major <u>Trends</u> and Causes



- Continuous quality improvement, teaching, and guidance






# Healthcare Reform – Local Government Denmark views on the future of the healthcare system

In Local Government Denmark, we recommend...

- Establishing a new structure surrounding the 21 emergency hospitals with politically anchored co-operation between all parts of the healthcare system, as well as the municipalities.
- Establishing a national agreement on how to restructure the treatment of citizens with chronic illnesses and non-debilitating psychiatric disorders, preferably by the end of 2021.
- Following up the new national agreements with official professional standards to aid in the goal of a more coherent trans-country healthcare system.
