

What to do if a rapid test* shows that you are positive for COVID-19?

**Rapid tests are also called 'antigen tests'.*

- Self-isolate immediately.
- You will be contacted by an employee from Coronaopsporing. You are also welcome to contact Coronaopsporing yourself on **tel. 32 32 05 11**.
- Take a *follow-up PCR test* as soon as possible. You can book a test on **coronaprover.dk**
- Do not use public transport and remember to wear a CE-marked face mask when going to the PCR test centre.

Why do I need a PCR test when a rapid test shows that I am positive for COVID-19?

- A PCR test may confirm or exclude that the rapid test has given the correct result.
- A PCR test can also show if you are infected with a virus variant. In this way, the authorities can monitor the spread of selected variants.
- *If your follow-up PCR test is positive*, you must continue to self-isolate. Please follow the link to read more at **www.sst.dk/en**

What should I do if the PCR test is negative?

- *If your follow-up PCR test is negative*, and you don't have any symptoms, you can stop self-isolating. Contact tracing can also be stopped, so your close contacts can stop self-isolating, and they no longer need to be tested. You can call Coronaopsporing on **tel. 32 32 05 11** for advice on how to stop contact tracing.



Tests are only a snapshot of your infection status

Tests – both rapid tests and PCR tests – are only a snapshot of whether you are infected with COVID-19 at the time of the test. It is therefore important that you continue to follow the guidance to prevent the spread of infection – such as social distancing, maintaining good hand hygiene and staying at home if you have symptoms – no matter what your test result is.
